



London-based chemical additive company moves to 'Sci-Park' in East Windsor

EAST WINDSOR — Elementis Specialties, a chemical additive company headquartered in London, has relocated its executive management staff to a new facility here, making it the first high-tech firm to migrate to the “Sci-Park” Science and Technology Center.

Township officials joined corporate leaders recently to cut the ribbon on the 66,000-square-foot facility, located on Old Trenton Road across from Windsor Corporate Park.

The first tenant in the planned four-building complex, the corporation moved from an office on Wycoffs Mill Road in Hightstown with roughly 125 employees.

“This new North American headquarters in East Windsor represents a substantial investment by Elementis and provides a cutting-edge technical facility to meet our customers’ evolving needs,” said David Dutro, Elementis president and CEO. “This investment also represents a strong commitment and confidence in the central New Jersey business environment.”

From industrial coatings to personal care products and offshore drilling, Elementis supplies additives used in a number of industries. Products include defoamers, colorants, waxes, and dispersing and wetting agents.

The products “enhance the feel, flow and finish of everyday products including surface coatings, building products, drilling fluids and cosmetics,” the company said in a press release.

The company earned \$134.5 million on \$760.5 million in sales last year, according to its website, topping its \$96 million profit the year before.

The firm is part of the new research and development complex designed specifically to accommodate high-tech industry tenants.

It falls within Einstein's Alley, an economic development initiative in Central New Jersey that seeks to promote the area's prominence in attracting, building and retaining high-tech companies.

Greg McClatchy, president of Elementis Specialties, said the location was prime.

"The Elementis team is thrilled to be located in Einstein's Alley here in East Windsor, a great place to live and work, especially for a high technology specialty chemicals company," he said.
